Personal Projects: Artist/historian

I am an arts practitioner with a focus on visual art, authorship, culture and Queensland history.

- My current project *One Voice Two Lives* takes another look at my 2008 *Responsible Heritage* thesis, this time focusing on local history, culture, creativity and heritage with a view producing a historical/biographical publication and creating new artworks based on the letters of William Henry (1876-1907).
- 2019-2023: **Drawing YOU In Carl Lumholtz in the Herbert** was developed in 2019 and included research at the Natural History Museum and the Museum of Cultural History in Norway, oral history gathering with Traditional Owners, commissioning of hunting tools and my own creativity. This resulted in a solo exhibition and 92pp hard cover publication launched at Tyto Regional Gallery in Ingham, June 2023. The exhibition will travel to Norway in mid 2025. The research component of the project was supported through the QAG | GOMA Foundation Vida Lahey Memorial Travel Scholarship and the project through Arts Qld QASP Program and RAF Quick Response Grants.
- 2009: Marks in the Scrub arts and cultural camp with Jirrbal Elder Ernie Grant. Funded by Arts Qld.
- 2003-8: *Responsible Heritage: Writing Back to Willie* (Phd Thesis and solo exhibition). This study drew on a collection of letters (1895-1906) written by William Henry "Bellenden Plains" and focussed on visual interpretation of narratives drawing on social history, museum studies and visual arts methodologies (USQ scholarship).
- 2008: Cardwell Historical Kirrama Range Oral History Project: I initiated and coordinated a project for the Cardwell & District Historical Society to facilitate, undertake and transcribe oral histories in and around the Kirrama Range area and deliver an oral history workshop for members.
- 2008: *Original Women*: Coordination and curation of an exhibition of artwork produced by women who painted in the Tully in the 1950s and 1960s. Funded by RADF Cardwell Shire Council.

coordination, administration, media and promotion, grant writing and acquittals, the development, implementation and reviews of a business plan and in liasion with artists facilitation of professional development opportunities, exhibitions, public art and other projects, cultural retention, licensing and other opportunities for Aboriginal Traditional Owners in the Girringun area of respresentation. I grew the program to include two new full-time positions and facilitated three traineeships for Traditional Owners. I variously developed, facilitated and travelled with artists to numerous exhibitions including Monaco, Paris, Poland, London, Fremantle, Perth, Melbourne, Shepparton, Sydney, Adelaide, Brisbane, Townsville, Darwin, Cairns and an Australia wide touring exhibition "Manggan – gather, gathers, gathering". I facilitated artists' representation in a number of major collections including the British Museum, National Gallery of Australia, National Museum of Australia, Parliament House Art Collection, ArtBank Sydney, National Maritime Museum Sydney, Lady Cilento Mater Children's Hospital Collection, State Library of Queensland, University of Qld Art Museum, Gallery of Modern Art Brisbane, ACIKE Collection Darwin, National Gallery of Victoria and numerous private collections. A number of artists won awards or were finalists in major competitions: Alison Murray (CIAF Emerging Artist Award 2017 and finalist ICAA Shepparton 2016); Philip Denham (IACA Emerging Artist Award 2017), Abe Muriata (finalist WA Indigenous Art Awards and finalist Telstra Art Awards twice); Emily Murray (finalist Telstra Art Award); Bagu on the Strand, (outdoor sculptural installation) Strand Ephemera (Girringun Artists - Excellence Award 2013), Townsville.
